2022 marked 30 years that National CORE has been providing quality affordable housing with a belief that onsite resident services are crucial to empowering its residents. And, each day, we witness the impact that our caring Hope team members have on the lives of our residents.

- 572 Youth enrolled in afterschool, teen & mentoring programs
- **720** Residents received economic mobility coaching and/or financial education
- **796** Residents received assistance applying for health and financial benefits and entitlements
- Thousands of residents received assistance applying for and receiving emergency rental assistance totaling **\$7.6 million** in debt relief
- 5,160 Participated in Health and Wellness Activities
- 949 Wellness Checks provided to Seniors and Families
- 2,000 Backpacks and school supplies distributed to children

- ✓ Making a measurable difference in the lives of our students:
- 3 New afterschool sites added in Pomona, Los Angeles and Houston
- 79% Reported doing better in school
- 83% Reported completing their homework on time
- 88% Feel staff provided needed listening and help
- 85% Learned something new about college or careers
- ✓ Teen Clubs Preparing teens for future self-sufficiency:
- 78% Learned something new about college or careers
- 78% Improved attitude about themselves
- 87% Shared that the program leader provided a listening ear and needed help
- ✓ Awarded \$28,000 in Building Bright Futures Scholarships to youth and adult learners
